Title: **Integrated Pest Management**

PURPOSE: To provide methods for preventing pest infestations and reporting pest concerns.

SCOPE: Hospital wide.

DEFINITIONS:

Integrated Pest Management (IPM): Coordinated use of pest and environmental information with available pest control methods to prevent pest populations, by the most economical means, with the least possible hazard to people, property and the environment.

PROCEDURES:

I. Responsibilities:

A. Departments

1. Report all pest problems to Hospital Custodial Services (HCS) at 4-1455.
2. Instruct staff to follow IPM strategies, as outlined in Section II.

B. Hospital Custodial Services

1. Receive all phone calls on pest problems and forward information to outside pest management contractor for corrective action.
2. Maintain pest complaint log book which contains a copy of the pest management contract, contractor’s NYSDEC business registration, Commercial Applicators’ identification cards and service reports.

C. Outside Pest Management Contractor

1. Provide HCS with a copy of their current NYSDEC Pesticide Business Registration and Commercial Applicators’ identification cards.
2. At the completion of each job, provide a written service report to HCS that includes the date/time/location of service, pest reported, scope of work including any products used, product labels, application method, and quantity of products used.

D. Plant Operations

Conduct maintenance to prevent pest infestation such as sealing penetrations in doors, ceilings, walls, windows and screens; containing and repairing water leaks, and repairing or replacing broken screens or netting.

II. Integrated Pest Management Strategies for Staff

- Store food in sealed containers.
- Keep areas free of food scraps, waste paper, boxes and other debris.
- Ensure all garbage containers are emptied frequently.
- Keep screens, windows, and doors to the outside of the building closed.
- Report water leaks and penetrations in doors, ceilings, walls, windows and screens to Plant Operations for repair.
- Do not tamper with any pest control equipment, such as glue boards, containerized bait stations, or traps, and follow any instructions provided by the pest management contractor.
- Under no circumstances shall staff apply any pesticides, including, but not limited to over the counter products such as Raid, boric acid and “roach motels”.

III. Off-site Facilities:

If a pest problem is identified in an off-site facility, staff shall notify the Off-site Facility Manager at 4-4380 or the Off-site EOC Coordinator at 4-4066 for assistance.
