THE JOB



A University Police officer is responsible for the detection and prevention of crime, and the enforcement of state and local laws, rules and regulations in a diverse educational environment throughout twenty-eight State University of New York campuses.

Officers are part of the educational process. They speak on topics such as sexual assault, drugs, crime prevention and traffic safety.

They develop and maintain a positive relationship with students faculty and staff in order to ensure the safety and cooperation of the entire campus community.

University Police adhere to high standards of personal and professional ethics

THE REQUIREMENTS

University Police Officers must meet the highest standards in New York State, as well as in the country for law enforcement officers.

To become a University Police Officer, a person must:

- Be 21 years old;
- Be a United States Citizen;
- Be a New York State Resident;
- Completed 60 hours of college credits;
- Possess a valid NYS drivers license;
- Pass a written Civil Service exam and be on their list for canvassing;
- Pass a medical examination;
- Have binocular acuity of 20/30 corrected or no less than 20/100 uncorrected;
- Pass a physical agility test (see agility chart);
- Pass a psychological examination;
- Pass an extensive background investigation;
- Complete a Basic School for Police Officers;
- Complete a probationary period.
